On the trips, law enforcement officials visit checkpoints, prisons, settlements, police stations, and other sites that are central to Israel's policies of occupation and apartheid.

These programs promote a two-way exchange of worst practices, bringing paramilitary tactics to U.S. policing and racist broken windows policies to Israeli military control, in addition to cementing practices of racial profiling, mass surveillance, police brutality, and suppression of political dissent that already exist in both countries.

As a Jewish organization, we feel a responsibility to hold organizations in our communities accountable. We call on Jewish institutions, especially those like the Anti-Defamation League, a self-proclaimed civil rights organization, to end their role in facilitating these deadly exchanges.

These exchanges rely on a dangerous myth, steeped in white supremacy, that safety for some can be achieved through violence against others. From the U.S. to Palestine, we know the path to real safety for all requires building joint struggles for justice and showing up to protect and defend one another. That's the exchange--between communities and people's movements--we're committed to fighting for.
